The Department is requesting authorization to enter into software license and service agreements with other jurisdictions and health and human services agencies for use of the "Twin Cities Healthy Start Screening and Case Management System" web-based application. The Department used federal funds for the development of the web-based data entry system based on Healthy Start specifications. These agreements, developed by the City Attorney's office, allow for licensing use of the application on an on-going basis.
