Background/Supporting Information Attached

The City of Minneapolis aims to insure that all one- and two-year-old Minneapolis children are tested for lead each year, mostly through blood lead testing at local pediatric clinics. In 2006, 64% of one-and two-year-olds were tested. This project, designed by MDHFS in partnership with the Lead Testing Task Force, will increase lead testing in the City by: designing materials for Minneapolis pediatric clinics to use in evaluating and improving their lead testing programs; visiting clinics to discuss barrier to testing; providing educational materials, community organization referral sources, and in-home lead testing kits for clinics to share with their patients; and evaluating the clinics' lead testing programs through voluntary chart audits and staff surveys.
